Redlands Meeting House and Cemetery



As Quakers moved west of the Susquehanna River, their numbers grew large and they sought to establish a Meeting at Newberrytown, York County, in 1738.It was granted Preparative Meeting status until the construction of a log meetinghouse was completed in 1745. Later, in 1811, a new meetinghouse was built two miles west and called Redlands. The two cemeteries and meetinghouse at Redlands became the responsibility of Menallen when Newberry Meeting was laid down in 1862. It was recently reopened seasonally for worship.

Directions from Warrington to Redlands: Follow Route 74 to light in Rossville. Go straight ahead on Route 177 for 5.9 miles to stop sign. Turn right on Route 382 for 4.1 miles. Redlands Meeting is on left.

Newberrytown Cemetery

The cemetery is located two miles east of the Redlands Meeting house and is maintained by Menallen Meeting.



Directions from Redlands
Meeting House to
Newberrytown Cemetery: Turn
left on Route 382. Go under
Interstate 83 and up a hill and at the
Y bear right. Go 1.8 miles. The
Cemetery is to the immediate



Menallen Meeting House and Cemetery



In 1748, a preparative
Meeting was established at Friends
Grove in what was then part of
Menallen Township. As growth
continued Menallen became a
separate Monthly Meeting in 1780, a
status that it has maintained to date.
In 1848, the log meetinghouse at
Friends Grove was moved to the
current site of the Meeting three
miles north of Biglerville, PA. In
1884, a brick meetinghouse was
built to replace the log structure. A
new cemetery was established and
remains an active burial site.

Directions from Gettysburg to Menallen Meetinghouse: From Gettysburg Square take Route 34 North through Biglerville (7.3 mi). Continue on Route 34 for 2.3 miles. Entrance to Menallen on right just past sign for meat market.

Friends Grove Cemetery

The cemetery at Friends Grove was neglected for many years but was cleaned up prior to the 1986 reunion of the Blackburn Family Association. The stone was placed at the cemetery to memorialize their ancestors.




Directions from Menallen to Friends
Grove: Return to Biglerville. At light go
left on Route 234 for 2.7 miles. Turn left
on Center Mills Road for a short distance
to Justice Excavating &Dunkards
Church. Friends Grove Cemetery is
behind parking lot of Justice.



Huntington Meeting House and Cemetery

In 1750, a preparative meeting was established near York Springs, PA. Friends obtained land for a Meetinghouse by 1766, with a permanent one erected in 1790. This structure remains much as it was then. Huntington Meeting was hard hit by western migration and was laid down in 1861 and put under the care of Menallen. Meetings for Worship are held on the first Sundays from April to October at Huntington. The building is occasionally used for funerals. The cemetery at Huntington is the burial site of William and Phebe Wright who have been documented as having assisted over 1000 fugitives from slavery on the Underground Railroad.

Directions from Friends Grove to Huntington: Return to Route 234. Turn left and follow 234 for 3.8 miles. Shortly after crossing Route 15 turn left on Gun Club Road. Follow 5.8 miles. Cross over Route 94 and Gun Club Road becomes Quaker Church Road. Huntington Meeting is .6 miles on the left.



Warrington Meeting House and Cemetery

Warrington Meeting was established about 1745 and a log structure served until the original part of the Friends' Meetinghouse in Warrington Township, was erected in 1769. The members doubled the building's size in 1782. It's one of three such Quaker built structures standing today across York County. After the western migration the meeting was laid down. Menallen Meeting cared for the cemetery and meetinghouse until Warrington Friends reestablished their Meeting in the 1940's.

Directions from Huntington to Warrington: Return to and turn right on Route 94 for 1.1 miles and turn right on Route 15.
Follow Route 15 for 8.4 miles to traffic light in Dillsburg. Turn right at the light and again right on to Route 74. Follow Route 74. 9.8 miles to Wellsville. Follow Route 74. Warrington is short distance on right.
